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## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

RE: 5 COVESIDE LANE, RAYMOND MAINE

After a review of the parcel file for 5 Coveside Lane (Tax Map 58, Lot 8) I have found the following facts:

- 1. A single-family dwelling existed on the lot on January 1, 1989, that was 600 square feet with a 108 square-foot deck.
- 2. This dwelling was built in the 1950s.
- 3. While the file is unclear, it appears as though this dwelling was completely destroyed by fire on November 30, 1996.
- 4. An HHE 200 form in the file notes a 1,000-gallon wastewater tank serves the dwelling. There is no mention made of a wastewater disposal field included with this septic system.
- 5. According to Assessing records, a 360-square-foot garage exists on the parcel.
- 6. On August 29, 2018, a permit was issued for the construction of a 31' x 20.5' single-family dwelling with two (2) bedrooms. This permit notes that the new structure would replace an existing of the same exact size, on the existing floor. Apparently, a tree fell on the existing structure.
- 7. A Certificate of Occupancy was issued on August 22, 2019, for a two-bedroom single-family dwelling.
- 8. The current structure is 635.5 square feet, with a 128-square-foot deck. This is an increase of 55.5 square feet of what existed on January 1, 1989.
- 9. The Town of Raymond cannot confirm or deny if a non-conforming structure can or cannot be expanded within 100' of the normal high-water line (NHWL) of Sebago Lake until a building permit application has been submitted. The approval or denial of this application would indicate to what extent the structure may be expanded.

- 12. A survey will likely be required in order to demolish and replace or expand a non-conforming structure.
