Starting July 27th, road improvements to Shaw Road will begin and included ditching, tree removal, culvert replacement, paving and other upgrades. When finished with Shaw Road, the Public Works Department will start with the same road improvements to Mountain Rd spanning from Conesca Road to the intersection of Tenny Hill Road where the new stop sign will be installed, making the intersection a two-way stop.

The Town of Raymond has received a grant from the "Keep Maine Healthy" initiative.
